

BEC-LL.B Course Structure

The course and credit structure below is intended to achieve the objective of BEc - LL. B (Bachelor of Economics and Bachelor of Laws) through the study of a five-year integrated programme, ten semesters, with 59 subjects and 188 credits. The last semester, Semester X, starts with a one-month long orientation workshop and is generally spent outside the law school for internship and clinical purposes under the supervision of assigned faculty members. The Academic Council of the Kathmandu University may revise the course and credit structure on the recommendation of the School of Law Faculty Board led by the Dean. The summary of the course and credit structure is as follows:

The syllabus developed for each subject is based on compelling contents and deep learning. The details of the syllabus are periodically revised by the concerned professor in consultation with the Dean of the School of Law.
